

Father Theodore's Message

Before reflecting on these upcoming months, I want to thank everyone who offers their time, talent, and treasure to the support, strengthening, and flourishing of our Holy Cross Church. As members of the body of Christ, it is essential that all of work together, support one another, and love one another. I encourage us to always be reflecting upon that, especially as we enter this upcoming Lenten season!

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we enter the springtime months of March, April, and May, we see rapidly approaching on the horizon the blessed season of Great and Holy Lent. For those of the western Christian traditions that commemorate Lent, this began for them on February 14. For us Orthodox Christians, following the ancient liturgical calendar, we begin Great Lent with Clean Monday, this year on Monday, March 18. There is a prayer in particular that we pray during Great Lent that many of us are familiar with. This prayer is attributed to St. Ephrem the Syrian and is as follows: "O Lord and Master of my life, do not permit the spirit of laziness and meddling, the lust for power and idle talk to come into me. Instead, grant me, Your servant, the spirit of prudence, humility, patience and love. Yes, Lord and King, give me the power to see my own faults and not to judge my brother. For You are blessed unto the ages of ages. Amen."



We will first pray that prayer at the Great Compline the evening of Monday, March 18, the first day of Great Lent and I encourage you to attend that service if you can! This Lenten prayer of St. Ephrem is only prayed during weekday services, thus, if we are only present on Sunday Divine Liturgies, we won't hear this prayer liturgically. However, that does not mean that this important Lenten prayer should not be a part of our lives. I remember when I first moved to Georgia when Presvytera Stacey and I were dating many moons ago. When I arrived with the moving truck, the very first stop was to her parents' home in Marietta. It was February; thus, it was sometime right around the beginning of Lent. One thing I tend to notice in a house are the things on the refrigerator; many people put pictures, notes, magnets, and other interesting momentos there. It is a bit of a reflection of the things that are important to them. One thing I very clearly remember on my future in-law's refrigerator was a piece of paper with the Prayer of St. Ephrem on it, hanging there front and center with a magnet. Now, at this time, I was not an Orthodox Christian or even a catechumen (yet!) - but for some reason this prayer caught my attention for multiple reasons, especially the content of the prayer and the placement of the prayer in such a prominent place. I also like to think that may be it served as a nice reminder that it was Lent as one was about to approach the refrigerator and find something extra tasty (i.e. non-fasting) inside! Kidding aside, this prayer made an impression on me and it did so by its being present in such a prominent place. If one had their eyes open, truly paying attention, it would be impossible to not meditate upon the holy words of this timeless prayer. This can and should be the case for all of us.

Even if we aren't able to attend Great Compline, the Pre-Sanctified Liturgy, or other weekday Lenten services, this prayer should be prominent in our lives, especially during Great Lent. Perhaps it might mean taping it onto the front of the refrigerator, on the mirror in the bathroom, or faithfully praying it with our morning and evening prayers. Maybe it could be a goal to memorize it and pray as a family or with your children? Wherever it may be—the repetition of this prayer during the holy days of Great Lent serves to commune with our God in prayer, to entreat Him for the fruitful things spoken of in the Prayer of St. Ephrem, and to instruct us on how we should live our lives as Orthodox Christians in a way that is beneficial unto our salvation. We hear the petition often Εὐλογητός εἶ, Κύριε, δίδαξόν με τα δικαιώματά σου. Blessed are you O Lord, teach me your statutes/commandments/rules of life.

This is one of the most important aspects of prayer - to instruct us in those things we should be praying for, in the way for us to live as Orthodox Christians, as people walking and being shaped in the Way. The faithful prayerful repetition of the Lenten Prayer of St. Ephrem from day to day assists us in that. We as people of the 21st century are so accustomed to immediacy, automation and efficiency in our day to day lives. Immediate food delivery, ChatGPT, Wikipedia, Google Translate, one could go on and on. This is not the reality of the growth in Christ, however. It takes patience and endurance- as Jesus said, with "endurance/patience, you will gain your lives." (Luke 21:19) Faithfully praying the holy words, being instructed and molded by these holy words, fruit will be born - it may not be tomorrow, or the next day, but it will come. I pray that we all have a good, blessed, holy, and fruitful Lenten season. $K\alpha\lambda\dot{\eta}$ $\Sigma\alpha\rho\alpha\kappao\sigma\dot{\eta}$, a good 40 days to us all!


