

Father Theodore's Message

Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is Risen!

Thus says the Lord: "I will take you from among the nations, gather you from all the lands, and bring you into your land. I shall sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be cleansed from all your uncleanness, and I will also cleanse you from all your idols. I shall give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you. I shall take the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I shall put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My requirements, and you will keep My judgments and do them. You will dwell in the land I gave to your fathers. You will be My people, and I shall be your God." – Exodus 36:24-28

As we begin the month of June, because of the later celebration of Pascha this year, we find ourselves still in the Paschal period! This means the celebration of Pentecost will be late this year – let's not lose sight of this beautiful celebration in the midst of our summertime activities! This important feast puts forth what we see Moses speaking of



in the book of Exodus – he was writing and prophesying about us: we (who are from among the nations) will be His people and He will be our God. What beautiful and joy-giving words! Speaking of summertime, I thought it would be helpful to shine a little extra light upon our Christian journey in Christ through His Holy Church that we celebrate and participate in during these coming summer months: As I noted earlier, in June, we will celebrate Pentecost on Sunday, June 23rd. Of course, on that day we will have the Kneeling Vespers at the end of the Divine Liturgy where we will all bend our knees before our Lord for the first time communally since Pascha, as one body and pray for that One Spirit to be renewed in each of us. The commemoration of Pentecost doesn't last only that Sunday, however. On the next day, the Monday of the Holy Spirit, we will have the Divine Liturgy once again and glorify the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy and Life-Giving Spirit. On the day before Pentecost, as per ancient tradition, we will have a Saturday of the Souls service where we gather and pray for all our departed brothers and sisters in Christ. Due to the very late occurrence of Pentecost this year, there is no Apostles' Fast... and we will celebrate the Holy Apostles in conjunction with the Sunday of All Saints!

In July, there are many beloved Saints celebrated – Marina, Elijah/Elias, Anna, Paraskevi, Panteleimon, and more. Having commemorated the pouring out of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we see it lived out in the lives of these holy men and women who no longer lived themselves, but in and through and with Christ living in them. They have become His people, they faithfully walked in His commandments, and now they intercede for us as they dwell near Him in eternal life. When we hear the hymnography magnifying the Saints, we can't help but be inspired by their lives in Christ in whatever way of life they may have lived: as a soldier, a doctor, a mother, whatever vocation they had, they glorified God therein. Please see the calendar for the commemorations and weekday services of these Saints!

In August, we come to the month of Panagia, of the Theotokos, and ever-virgin Mary, the Mother of our Lord. Of course, we celebrate her Dormition (Repose) on the 15th of this month. Before we get to the commemoration of her departure from this life, we honor her with a fast during the first two weeks of August. We have many celebrations of the Paraklesis service during those first two weeks of the month. At these services, we ask for the Panagia's motherly intercession for us and for our loved ones who we will remember by name during the services.

For many, summer is a time of vacation, relaxation, recharging, and renewal. Yet, in the Church, and in the life in Christ, it is also a beautiful time of celebration, commemoration, and renewal in the Holy Spirit. Just as Moses said so long ago, let us continue that journey of transfiguration in Christ and put off that heart of stone and foster that heart of flesh which is a gift of God and only comes through Christ our true God to whom belong all the glory along with His everlasting Father and the Holy and Life-giving Spirit now and forever. Amen!
