Verse: Bring to the Lord, O you sons of God, bring to the Lord glory and honor. (Psalm 28)

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The reading is from Paul's First *Letter to the Corinthians.* (1:10-17)

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Brethren, I appeal to you by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no dissensions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brethren. What I mean is that each one of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius; lest any one should say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized any one else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

Καὶ εὐθέως ἠνάγκασεν ὁ Ίησοῦς τοὺς μαθητὰς αὐτοῦ ἐμβῆναι είς τὸ πλοῖον καὶ προάγειν αὐτὸν είς τὸ πέραν, ἕως οὖ ἀπολύση τοὺς ὄχλους.

throng; and he had compassion on them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a lonely place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They said to him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass; and taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven, and blessed, and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women children. Then he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

Today our Holy Orthodox Church commemorates:

After-feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos

This feast was celebrated on August 15 and the after-feast lasts until August 23. The Feast of Panagia Prousiotissa is celebrated on August 23, as well.

The Holy Martyrs Floros and Lauros of Illyria (+2nd Century) along with the 300 Paupers martyred and inspired by Sts. Florus and Laurus

These Marturs were twin brothers, and stonemasons. After the martyrdom of their teachers Proclus and Maximus, they left Byzantium and came to the city of Ulpiana in Illyricum, where a certain Licinius hired them to build a temple for the idols. The wages he gave them, they distributed to the poor, and when the temple was built, Floros and Lauros gathered the paupers, and with their help put ropes about the necks of the idols, pulled them to the ground, and furnished the temple as a church. When Licinius learned of this, he had the paupers burned alive in a furnace. Floros and Lauros were tormented, then cast into a deep well, where they gave up their souls to the Lord. When their holy relics were recovered years later, they poured forth myrrh and worked many miracles; they were enshrined in Constantinople.

- The Holy Martyrs Hermus, Serapion, and Polyaenus of Rome (+2nd Century)
- The Holy Martyr Juliana near Stroblius and the Holy Martyr Leo near Myra in Lycia
- The Four Devout Ascetics in the Desert
- Our Fathers among the Saints, John (+674) and George (+683), Patriarchs of Constantinople
- The Translation of the Relics of Our Devout and God -Bearing Father Arsenios the New from Paros (+1877)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (pg. 8 in the Small Book/pg. 37 in the Hymnal):

Hymn of the Dormition (Εν τη Γεννήσει, First Mode):

You gave birth yet preserved your virginity. You fell asleep in death yet did not desert the world, O Theotokos. You were transported to life, as you are Mother of Life and, by virtue of your intercessions, deliver our souls from death. (Sung before the Small Entrance and after the Hymn of the Resurrection)

Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (Κατέλυσας τω Σταυρώ σου, Grave Mode):

You destroyed death by Your Cross, You opened Paradise to the Robber. You turned the Myrrh-bearing Women's lament into joy, and You commanded Your Apostles to preach that You rose, O Christ God, granting the world the great mercy.

Hymn of Panagia Prousiotissa (Της Ελλάδος, First Mode):

As champion of all Greece you stand arrayed, and worker of extraordinary wonders by Your Icon from Proussa, Immaculate Virgin Mary; for swiftly you give light to the blind, drive dread demons far away, and also loving Lady, brace the paralyzed. All those who have recourse to you, you save from beetling cliffs and every harm. Glory to your child-bearing without seed! Glory to the One who made you great! Glory to the One who through you works

Hymn of the Memorial Service (Μνήσθητι, Κύριε, Plagal of the Fourth Mode):

Remember, O Lord, as You are good, Your servant, and forgive every sin he has committed in this life. For no one is sinless except You, Who has power to grant rest to those who have fallen asleep.

Humn of the Holu Cross (Σώσον Κύριε, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy

The Kontakion of the Dormition (Την εν πρεσβείαις, Second

The Theotokos is undying in intercession. Immovable is our hope in her for protection. Neither death nor burial prevailed over her. As she is Mother of Life, she was removed to life by Him, the Lord who lived in her ever-virgin womb.

Weekly Wisdom of the Fathers:

St. John of Damascus on how iconography encourages us: "All images reveal and make perceptible those things which are hidden. For example, a man does not have immediate knowledge of invisible things, since the soul is veiled by the body. Nor can man have immediate knowledge of things which are distant from each other or separated by place, because he himself is limited by place and time. Therefore the icon was devised that he might advance in knowledge, and that secret things might be revealed and made perceptible. Therefore, icons are a source of profit, help, and salvation for all, since they make things so obviously manifest, enabling us to perceive hidden things. Thus, we are encouraged to desire and imitate what is good and to shun and hate what is evil."
