# Father Theodore's Message

O Cross, you are the guardian of the whole world. \*O Cross, you are the height of the Church's beauty. \*O Cross, you are what strengthened the Emperors. \*O Cross, the believers' firm support. \*O Cross, the glory of Angels \* and the defeat of the demons.

Exapostilarion on September 14, the Elevation of the Holy Cross

My beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we come to the month of September, we will be surrounded by words of praise for the Holy Cross. Our parish has the great honor of being named after the Life-Giving Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. We will celebrate the Name Day of our parish in a twofold manner. First, we will have a Holy Vigil to celebrate the feast on the evening of Friday, September 13, starting at 7:00pm. We will celebrate with great reverence the Great Vespers, Orthros, and Divine Liturgy that evening. If you've never been to a vigil, this is a great opportunity to experience this very traditional celebration! On Sunday, September 15, we will celebrate a Festal Orthros and Divine Liturgy followed by a Panagiri/Celebration and then the 3rd Annual Pan-Orthodox Cross Dive. It should be a wonderful weekend!



Yet, we do not only honor the Holy Cross in mid-September. The Holy Cross is something that should be a part of our life, in our thought process every day. What are some practical ways that we can honor the Cross day to day? Let me share with you some thoughts!

Wear a cross - When we were baptized and/or chrismated, we received a cross to wear from our Godparent. We should wear this cross or a similar cross all the time! This reminds us of the day that we began our journey in Christ and the necessity for us to pick up our cross daily as we are instructed to in Holy Scripture.

Cross yourself correctly - Sometimes it may be easy for us to take crossing ourselves for granted. There is even a bit of a joke about haphazardly making the cross "like a bouzouki" (look it up if you don't get the image!) Tracing ourselves with the sign of the Cross is something attested to by the Fathers from the earliest centuries. When we cross ourselves, it is a powerful physical movement attesting to trust in our Lord who was crucified and resurrected for our sake and for our salvation. It is also a beautiful witness of our faith to those who might see us cross ourselves!

Begin/end activities with the Cross - In particular, at the beginning and ending of a journey, it is beautiful to cross ourselves and either ask for our Lord's protection or thank Him for a safe journey. This same rule can be applied to when we begin and complete a meal, begin and complete the reading of the Bible, or even when we begin and complete a run through the park!

Make the sign of the Cross passing an Orthodox Church - When we pass by the front of an Orthodox Church, we should cross ourselves as an acknowledgement that we are passing by the place where we worship our God, that place which is set apart. We should also consider that in the same manner, we should cross ourselves when passing through the middle of the Church. This is out of respect and reverence to the reserve sacrament of Holy Communion which is always present on the Holy Altar.

Fast on Fridays (in addition to Wednesdays) - Fridays are almost always fasting days as this is the day that our Lord was crucified on the Cross. On that day, that object of torture, the cross, became a sign of victory, the Holy Cross. Our fast encourages us to not betray our Lord as did Judas (on Holy Wednesday), but to put our own often selfish and earthly desires aside and to focus on what is truly needful.

Read the Holy Scriptures and see the image of the Holy Cross - If we are attentive to our reading of the Bible, we see the cross present in many other places beyond the Crucifixion. It is prefigured in the Old Testament. It is spoken of by Christ during His ministry. And as we read further in the New Testament, it is no longer a thing of foolishness and weakness but the power of God to us who read Holy Scripture as Christians and place our hope in Him.

As members of the parish of the Holy Cross, let us reflect upon all of the ways that the Cross of Christ is ever-present in our lives. Not as a sign of defeat, but as a sign of our Lord's love, power, and conquering of death! Considering these examples I have shared with you, strive to make the Holy Cross a daily part and reflection of your life as an Orthodox Christian as this contributes to, as we recite at every Divine Liturgy, to wholly "commit ourselves and one another to Christ our God!"

Through the power of Your Cross, save us, O Lord!






