The reading is from Paul's Letter *to the Galatians.* (2:16-20)

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Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

## **Today our Holy Orthodox Church** commemorates:

After-feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross

This Great Feast was celebrated yesterday, September 14. The after-feast lasts until September 21. We will process the Holy Cross at the end of the Liturgy today.

+ The Holy Great Martyr Nikitas (+372)

This Saint was of high birth among the Goths beyond the Danube River. He was taken by Athanaric, pagan ruler of the Goths, and after being tortured, was burned to death for his confession of Christ. According to some, this took place during the reign of Saint Constantine the *Great*; according to others, under the Emperor Gratian.

- Our Devout Father Philotheos the Presbyter and Wonder-worker of Asia Minor (+10th Century)
- Our Devout Father Porphyrios the Mime of Caesarea (+361)
- The Holy Martyr Maximos (+305)
- The Holy Two Maiden Martyrs
- Our Father among the Saints, Symeon, Archbishop of Thessaloniki (+1429)
- Our Father among the Saints, Bessarion, Archbishop of Larissa (+1499)
- Our Father among the Saints, Joseph the New, Metropolitan of Timişoara, Romania (+1656)
- Our Devout Father Gerasimos, founder of the Holy Trinity Monastery in Zagora (+1740)
- The Holy New Martyr John the Cretan (+1811)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercu on us and save us. Amen.

Weeklu Resurrectional Hymn (Ευφραινέσθω τα ουράνια, Third Mode):

Let the heavens be glad. Let the earth rejoice exceedingly. For the Lord has shown strength with his arm. He trampled death by death. He became the first-born of the dead. Out of the belly of Hades, He has rescued us, and to the world He has granted the great mercy. (Sung after the Small Entrance, Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 106)

• The Kontakion of the Holy Cross (O υψωθείς εν τω Σταυρώ, Fourth Mode):

You who were lifted on the cross voluntarily, O Christ our God, bestow Your tender compassions upon Your new community to which You gave Your name. Cause our faithful emperors to be glad in Your power, granting them the victories against their adversaries. And for an ally, Lord, may they have You, peace as their armor, the trophy invincible. (Greek *Text found in hymnal on pg. 232)*
