For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God — not because of works, lest any man should For boast. we are workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

Τῷ καιρῷ ἐκείνῳ, ἐγένετο ἐν | At that time, as Jesus drew near to Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the roadside begging; and hearing a multitude going by, inquired what this meant. They told him, "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by." And he cried, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And those who were in front rebuked him, telling him to be silent: but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And Jesus stopped, and commanded him to be brought to him; and when he came near, he asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed glorifying God; and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

Today our Holy Orthodox Church commemorates:

The Holy Prophet Nahum (Ναούμ) (+7th c. BC)

The Prophet Nahum had Elkesaeus (Elkosh) as his homeland, and was from the tribe of Symeon; he is seventh in order among the twelve Minor Prophets He prophesied during the time of Hezekias, after the destruction of Samaria (721 years before Christ), but before the ten tribes were taken into captivity; he prophesied against Nineveh, the capital of Assyria. His name means "comforter." His book of prophecy is divided into three chapters.

Our Devout Father Philaret (Φιλάρετος) the Merciful

Saint Philaret a native of Paphlagonia in Asia Minor, was a virtuous Christian layman who lived in lawful wedlock and raised a family. He was most renowned for his generosity to all in need. With the permission of God, in a short space of time he lost the greater part of his possessions to theft and other misfortunes and was left with nothing but his family, his home, and a little livestock. Yet he continued to give generously to the poor despite the faint-heartedness of his family, who reproached him for giving alms when they were in need themselves; and God, seeing his faith, restored his prosperity to him many times over. He foresaw the day of his death, and reposed in an odour of sanctity in Constantinople in 789.

- The Holy Martyr Ananias (Αναγίας) the Persian (+345)
- Our Devout Father Anthony (Αντώνιος) the New (+865)
- Our Father among the Saints Onisimos (Ονήσιμος), Archbishop of Ephesus (+107)
- Our Father among the Saints Theocletos (Θεόκλητος). Archbishop of Sparta and Lakedaemonia (+870)
- Our Fathers among the Saints Ananias (Ανανίας) and Solochon (Σολόχων), Archbishops of Ephesus

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (pg. 8 in the Small Book/pg. 37 in the Hymnal):

Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (Αγγλικαί δυνάμεις), Plagal Second Mode):

When the angelic powers appeared at Your tomb, the soldiers guarding it feared and became as dead. And standing by the sepulcher was Mary, who was seeking Your immaculate body. Unassailed by Hades, You divested it of spoils. Then You met the Virgin. You granted life. O Lord, risen from the dead, glory to You! (Sung before and after the Small Entrance, *Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 118)*

Hymn of the Holy Cross (Σώσον Κύριε, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross.

Kontakion of the Memorial Service (Μνήσθητι, Κύριε, Plagal 4th Mode):

Remember, O Lord, as You are good, Your servants, and forgive every sin they have committed in this life. For no one is sinless except You, Who has power to grant rest to those who have fallen asleep.

The Kontakion of the Preparation for the Nativity of Christ, Η Παρθένος σήμερον, Third Mode):

On this day the Virgin Maid goes to the grotto to give birth to the pre-eternal Word in an ineffable manner. Dance for joy, all the inhabited earth, on hearing. Glorify along with Angels and with the shepherds Him who willed that He appear as a newborn Child, the pre-eternal God. (Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 240)
