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The reading is from Paul's Letter to the Galatians. (2:16-20)

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Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

# The Holy Gospel Reading according to St. Luke (12:16-21) Ninth Sunday of Luke

Ταῦτα λέγων ἐφώνει. Ὁ ἔχων ὧτα ἀκούειν, ἀκουέτω.

The Lord said this parable: "The land of a rich man brought forth plentifully; and he thought to himself, 'What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store crops?' And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, you have ample 'Soul, goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." As he said these things, he cried out: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

### **Today our Holy Orthodox Church** commemorates:

Our Father among the Saints Gregory (Γρηγόριος) the Wonderworker, Bishop of Neocaesarea (+266)

Saint Gregory was born in Neocaesarea of Pontus to parents who were not Christians. He studied in Athens, in Alexandria, in Beirut, and finally for five years in Caesarea of Palestine under Origen, by whom he was also instructed in the Faith of Christ. Then, in the year 240, he became bishop of his own city, wherein he found only seventeen Christians. By the time the Saint reposed about the year 265, there were only seventeen unbelievers left there. Virtually the whole duration of his episcopacy was a time of continual, marvellous wonders worked by him. Because of this, he received the surname "Wonderworker"; even the enemies of the truth called him a second Moses.

- Our Devout Father Lazarus (Λάζαρος) the Confessor, the Iconographer (+857)
- The Devout Fathers Zacaharias (Ζαχαρίας) the Leather-worker and John ( $I\omega\dot{\alpha}vv\eta\varsigma$ ) (+3<sup>rd</sup> Century)
- Our Devout Father Longinus (Λογγίνος) of Egypt (+4th Century)
- Our Father among the Saints Gennadios (Γεννάδιος), Patriarch of Constantinople (+471)
- Our Devout Father Maximos (Μάξιμος), Patriarch of Constantinople (+434)
- Our Devout Father Justin (Ιουστίνος)
- Our Devout Father Gennadios (Γεννάδιος), monk of the Monastery of Vatopedi (+14th Century)
- The Venerable Hilda (Χίλντα), Abbess of Whitby Abbey (+680)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

### Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (pg. 8 in the Small Book/pg. 37 in the Hymnal):

Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (Το φαιδρόν, Fourth Mode):

When the women disciples of the Lord heard the Angel joyously proclaim the resurrection, they cast aside the ancestral verdict, and boasting in glory they said to the Apostles, "Death has been despoiled! Christ God has risen, granting the great mercy to the world!" (Sung before and after the Small Entrance, *Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 110)* 

Hymn of St. Gregory (Εν προσευχαίς γρηγορών, *Plagal Fourth Mode):* 

By your accomplishments, you earned the name that you bore, for you were vigilant in prayer and diligent in working miracles. Therefore, holy father Gregory, intercede with Christ our God, that He illumine our souls, lest we fall asleep in sin unto death.

Hymn of the Holy Cross (Σώσον Κύριε, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross.

The Kontakion of the Entrance of the Theotokos (Ο Καθαρώτατος ναός. Fourth Mode):

The Savior's most pure and immaculate temple, the very precious bridal chamber and Virgin, who is the sacred treasure of the glory of God, on this day is introduced into the House of the Lord, and with herself she brings the grace in the divine Spirit. She is extolled by the Angels of God. A heavenly tabernacle is she. (Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 236)

### **Weekly Wisdom of the Fathers:**

St. Andrew of Crete (+740) writing about the Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple and the early ministry of the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary: "Thus the immaculate fruition issuing forth from the womb occurred from an infertile mother, and then the parents, in the first blossoming of her growth brought her to the temple and dedicated her to God. The priest, then making the order of services, beheld the face of the girl and of those in front of and behind, and he became gladdened and joyful, seeing as it were the actual fulfillment of the Divine promise. He consecrated her to God, as a reverential gift and propitious sacrifice and, as a great treasury unto salvation, he led her within the very innermost parts of the temple. Here the Maiden walked in the upright ways of the Lord, as in bridal chambers, partaking of heavenly food until the time of betrothal, which was preordained before all the ages by Him Who, by His inscrutable mercy, was born from her, and by Him Who before all creation and time and expanse Divinely begat Him, ..."
