The reading is from the Acts of the Apostles. (2:1-11)

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When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselvtes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

The Holy Gospel Reading according to St. John (7:37-52, 8:12) Sunday of Holy Pentecost

Πάλιν οὖν αὐτοῖς ὁ Ἰησοῦς ἐλάλησε λέγων. έγώ είμι τὸ φῶς τοῦ κόσμου. ὁ ἀκολουθῶν έμοι ου μη περιπατήση έν τη σκοτία, άλλ' ἕξει τὸ φῶς τῆς ζωῆς.

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me as the scripture has said, out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Holy Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priest and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemus, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Today our Holy Orthodox Church commemorates:

Sunday of Holy Pentecost (Κυριακή της Πεντηκοστής)

After the Saviour's Ascension into the Heavens, the eleven Apostles and the rest of His disciples, the God-loving women who followed after Him from the beginning, His Mother, the most holy Virgin Mary, and His brethren-all together about 120 souls returned from the Mount of Olives to Jerusalem. Entering into the house where they gathered, they went into the upper room, and there they persevered in prayer and supplication, awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit, as their Divine Teacher had promised them. In the meanwhile, they chose Matthias, who was elected to take the place of Judas among the Apostles.

Thus, on this day, the seventh Sunday of Pascha, the tenth day after the Ascension and the fiftieth day after Pascha, at the third hour of the day from the rising of the sun, there suddenly came a sound from Heaven, as when a mighty wind blows, and it filled the whole house where the Apostles and the rest with them were gathered. Immediately after the sound, there appeared tongues of fire that divided and rested upon the head of each one. Filled with the Spirit, all those present began speaking not in their native tongue, but in other tongues and dialects, as the Holy Spirit instructed them.

In celebration of Pentecost and the Descent of the Holu Spirit. there is no fasting this coming week.

- Transfer of the relics of the Holy Great-Martyr Theodore the Commander (Θεόδωρος του Στρατηλάτου) (+319)
- Synaxis of the Most Holy Theotokos and the Archangel Michael in Sosthenio district of Constantinople
- The Holy Martyrs Nicander (Νίκανδρος) and Marcian Μαρκιανός) at Dorostolum in Moesia (+297)
- The Holy Martyr Kalliopi (Καλλιόπη) at Rome (+250)
- The Devout Naucratius (Ναυκράτιος), brother of St. Basil the Great (+4th Century)
- The Holy New Martyr Theophanes (Θεοφάνης) in Constantinople (+1559)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.



Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (page 8 in the Pew Book):

Hymn of Pentecost (Ευλογητός ει, Plagal 4th Mode):

Blessed are You, O Christ our God. You made the fishermen all-wise, by sending down upon them the Holy Spirit, and through them You drew the world into Your net. O Lover of mankind, glory to You. (Sung before and after the Small Entrance, Greek text in hymnal on pg. 172)

Special Small Entrance Hymn (Υψώθητι, Κύριε, 2nd *Mode*):

Be exalted, O Lord, in Your power; we will sing and praise Your mighty deeds. Save us, O good Comforter. We sing to You. Alleluia.

- The Hymn of the Holy Cross is not sung today due to it being one of the Great Feasts.
- The Kontakion of Pentecost (Ότε καταβάς, Plagal 4th Mode):

When the Most High God came down and confused the tongues, He divided the nations. When He distributed the tongues of fire, He called all to unity. And with one voice we glorify the all-holy Spirit. (*Greek text in hymnal on pg. 274*)

Instead of "Agios o Theos" (Όσοι εις Χριστόν, 1st Mode):

You who have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ, Alleluia. (Greek text in hymnal on pg. 292)

Instead of "Axion Estin" (Μη της φθοράς, Grave Mode):

When you conceived, you experienced no deflowerment. You lent your flesh to the Logos, through whom all things were made. Therefore we magnify you, Virgin Theotokos, Mother who knew no man, space and holder of your Maker, who is uncontainable and infinite.

Communion Hymn (To $\pi v \varepsilon \dot{v} \mu \alpha \sigma o v$):

Your good Spirit shall guide me in the land of uprightness. Alleluia. (Psalm 142)

Weekly Wisdom of the Fathers:

St. Cyril of Jerusalem, summarizing what has occurred with the coming of Pentecost and the descent of the Holy Spirit: "And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit' (Acts 2:3-4). They partook of fire, not of burning but of saving fire; of fire which consumes the thorns of sins, but gives luster to the soul. This is now coming upon you also, and that to strip away and consume your sins which are like thorns, and to brighten vet more that precious possession of your souls, and to give you grace; for He gave it then to the Apostles. And He sat upon them in the form of fiery tongues, that they might crown themselves with new and spiritual diadems by fiery tongues upon their heads. A fiery sword barred of old the gates of Paradise; a fiery tongue which brought salvation restored the gift."
