The reading is from Paul's Letter *to the Galatians.* (2:16-20)

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Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be iustified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

### **Today our Holy Orthodox Church** commemorates:

Leave-taking of the Elevation of the Holy and Life-Giving Cross

The Elevation of the Holy and Life-Giving Cross was celebrated last Sunday, September 14. Today is the Leavetakina ( $A\pi\delta\delta\sigma\sigma$ ) or "Givina Up" of the Feast until its celebration the following year.

The Holy Apostle Quadratus (Κοδράτος) (+117)

Saint Quadratus was a disciple of the Apostles, and became Bishop of Athens, According to the Sunaxaristes, he contested for the Faith in the year 117, in the reign of Hadrian (117-138), but according to others, in the reign of Marcus Aurelius (161-

The Holy Prophet Jonah (Ιωνάς) (+8th Century BC)

The Prophet Jonah, the son of Amathi, of the town of Geth-hopher (IV Kings 14:25), was of the tribe of Zabulon; he prophesied during the years 838-810 before Christ. Jonah' book of prophecy is divided into four chapters, and is placed fifth in order among the twelve minor Prophets. His three-day sojourn in the sea-monster's belly is an image of our Saviour's three-day burial and His life-bringing Resurrection (Matt. 12:39-40). His name means "dove."

- Our Devout Father Jonah of St. Savvas Monastery (+9th Century)
- The Holy Martyr Efsevios (Ευσέβιος) of Phoenicia (+2nd Century)
- The Holy Martyrs and Siblings Efsevios (Ευσέβιος), Nestabus (Νέσταβος), and Zeno (Ζήνων) of Gaza (+360)
- Our Holy Fathers Meltios (Μελέτιος) and Isakios (Ισσάκιος), Bishops of Cyprus
- The Holy Martyr Priskos (Πρίσκος) of Phyrgia
- The Holy Six Martyrs, lieutenants of Maximian (+298)

### Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (page 8 in the Pew Book):

Hymn of the Holy Cross (Σώσον Κύριε, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross. (Sung before the Small Entrance and after the Hymn of the Resurrection. Greek text found on the back of the bulletin)

Special Entrance Hymn for the Feast:

Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at the footstool of His feet; for He is holy. Save us, O Son of God, risen from the dead. We sing to You, Alleluia.

Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (Αγγελικαί δυνάμεις, Plagal Second Mode):

When the angelic powers appeared at Your tomb, the soldiers guarding it feared and became as dead. And standing by the sepulcher was Mary, who was seeking Your immaculate body. Unassailed by Hades, You divested it of spoils. Then You met the Virgin. You granted life. O Lord, risen from the dead, glory to You! (Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 118)

The Kontakion of the Holy Cross (Ο υψωθείς εν τώ Σταυρώ, Fourth Mode):

You who were lifted on the cross voluntarily, O Christ our God, bestow Your tender compassions upon Your new community to which You gave Your name. Cause our faithful emperors to be glad in Your power, granting them the victories against their adversaries. And for an ally, Lord, may they have You, peace as their armor, the trophy invincible. (Greek Text found in Hymnal on pg. 233)
