The reading is from Paul's Second *Letter to the Corinthians.* (6-1:10)

Brethren, working together with him, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, labors, tumults, watching, hunger; purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

### The Holy Gospel Reading according to St. Luke (5:1-11) First Sunday of Luke

standing by the lake of Gennesaret, he saw two boats by the lake; but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had ceased speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at vour word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and as their nets were breaking, they beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he was astonished, and all who were with him, at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

#### **Today our Holy Orthodox Church** commemorates:

Our Devout Father Chariton (Χαρίτων) the Confessor (+350)

Saint Chariton was born in the city of Iconium during the reign of Aurelian, about the year 274. He was arrested, tortured, and condemned to death because of his Christian Faith, but finally set free by imperial edict. He came to Palestine, where he took up the ascetic life. He also brought many Jews and pagans to the Faith. Having dwelt in the desert of Judea for many years, and established several monasteries throughout the region, he reposed in peace.

+ The Holy Prophet Baruch (Βαρουχ) (+6th Century BC)

The Prophet Baruch was the son of Nerias, and the disciple of the Prophet Jeremias (Jer. 39:12; 43:4 LXX). The extant prophetical book that he wrote is divided into five chapters; it was composed in the fifth year of the Babylonian Captivity of the Jews during the years of Sedekias, 583 B.C. The prophetic lection that is read on the eve of the Feast of Christ's Nativity, which bears Jeremias' name, is taken from the prophecy of Baruch (Bar. 3:35-4:4). His name means "blessed."

- The Holy Martyrs and Brothers Alexander (Αλέξανδρος), Alfeus (Αλφειός), and Zosimos (Ζώσιμος); the Holy Martyr Mark (Μάρκος) the Shepherd; the Holy Martyrs Nikon (Νίκων), Neo (Νέων), Heliodoros (Ηλιόδωρος), and the other virgins and children (+4th Century)
- The Holy Martyr Eustathios (Ευστάθιος) the Roman
- The Holy Martyr Alexander (Αλέξανδρος) and the 30 others martyrs with him
- The Holy Martyr Wenceslas (Βιασεσλάβος) I of Bohemia, Prince of the Czechs (+935)
- The Venerable Auxentius (Αυξέντιος) the Alaman, ascetic and wonderworker of Cyprus (+12th Century)
- Our Devout Father Exuperius, Bishop and Confessor of Toulouse (+411)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

With the rivers of your tears you made the barren desert bloom; and with your sighs from deep within, you made your labors bear their fruits a hundredfold; and you became a star, illuminating the world by your miracles, O Chariton our devout father. Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

O good Lady, we implore you, quickly come unto our aid, when we cry out to you with faith. Hurry to intercession, and hasten to supplication, O Theotokos who protect now and ever those who honor you. Saint Gregory of Nyssa on the remedy to so many of the difficulties of life: "Let us first consider what peace is. Surely it is nothing else but a loving disposition towards one's neighbor.
