Today our Holy Orthodox Church commemorates:

Our Devout Mother Charitina (Χαριτίνη) of Amisus (+290)

Saint Charitina contested for Christ during the reign of Diocletian, in the year 290. The handmaid of a certain Claudius, she was betrayed as a Christian to Dometian, the Count, before whom she fearlessly confessed Christ, After suffering the most terrible tortures, including the uprooting of her teeth and nails, she gave up her soul into the hands of the

The Holy Martyr Mameltha (Μαμέλγθα) of Persia (+344)

The Martyr Mameltha of Persia was, before her conversion to the Christian Faith, a pagan priestess of the goddess Artemis. The saint's sister convinced her to accept Baptism. When the pagans saw Mameltha in her white baptismal robe, they stoned her. The saint suffered in the year 344. Later, a church was dedicated to her on the site of the temple of Artemis.

Our Fathers among the Saints Peter (Πέτρος), Alexis (Αλέξιος), Jonah (Ιώνας), Hermogenes (Ερμογένης), and Tikhon (Τύχων), Metropolitans of Moscow

The feast of the Hierarchs of Moscow was established during the reign of Tsar Theodore Ioannovich and Patriarch Job in the year 1596. Their individual feasts are: Saint Peter (+1326), December 21, and August 24, translation of holy relics; Saint Alexis (+14th cent.). February 12, and May 20, recovery of holy relics; Saint Jonah (+1461), March 31 and June 15, with the recovery of his holy relics celebrated on May 27. In 1875, at the proposal of Metropolitan Innocent of Moscow, to this feast was joined the commemoration of Saint Philip of Moscow (+1569), whose feast is kept on January 9, and the recovery of his holy relics on July 3. In more recent times, the holy Patriarch's Hermogenes (+1612) and Tikhon (+1925) have been added to the Synaxis. Saint Hermogenes, who was starved to death by the Poles, is also celebrated on February 17 and May 12, and Saint Tikhon, a confessor under the atheist voke, on March 25. the Menaion service itself makes reference only to Saints Peter, Alexis, Jonah, and Philip.

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (Εξ ύψους, Plagal Fourth Mode):

You descended from on high, O compassionate One, and consented to a three-day burial, to free us from the passions. O Lord, our life and resurrection, glory to You! (Sung before and after the Small Entrance. Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 126)

Hymn of the Holy Cross (Σώσον Κύριε, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross. (Greek text found on the back of the bulletin).

The Normal Kontakion of the Theotokos (Προστασία των Χριστιανών, Second Mode):

O Protection of Christians that never falls. intercession with the Creator that never fails, we sinners beg you, do not ignore the voices of our prayers. O good Lady, we implore you, quickly come unto our aid, when we cry out to vou with faith. Hurry to intercession, and hasten to supplication, O Theotokos who protect now and ever those who honor you. Weekly Wisdom of the Fathers and Mothers of our Holy Orthodox Church:

St. Basil in his work On the Holy Spirit, encourage us to true asceticism: "Beware of limiting the good of fasting to mere abstinence from meats. Real fasting is alienation from evil. 'Loose the bands of wickedness.' For give your neighbor the mischief he has done you. Forgive him his trespasses against you. Do not 'fast for strife and debate.' You do not devour flesh, but you devour your brother. You abstain from wine, but you indulge in outrages. You wait for evening before you take food, but you spend the day in the law courts. Woe to those who are 'drunken, but not with wine.' Anger is the intoxication of the soul, and makes it out of its wits like wine.
