


God was always with us, but on the first Christmas, He was with us in a new and special way!

Today we celebrate all of the holy saints from the Old Testament. They loved God and were close to Him, but they lived before our Lord, Jesus Christ became man. The icon below shows the holy forefathers, holy men saints who came before Christ. But today we also celebrate the holy foremothers, women saints who came before Christ.

One saint is the holy foremother Ruth. She was the great-grandmother of King David, and kind of like a great-great-great (28 greats) grandmother of Jesus. You can read the story of Ruth in the Bible, because there is a whole book about her. Ruth had a sad young

life, because her husband died. The Bible tells us she lived with her mother-in-law, and she always took care of her mother-in-law. She was always loving and loyal, and so she is an example to all of us.

Even though they lived so long ago, these special foremothers and forefathers can be examples for us! We can see their patience and love for God and try to have that too.
