How do I become a member of the parish?

Membership in the Orthodox Church begins with the Holy Sacrament of Baptism and Chrismation and continues throughout our life. We are united with Christ through the sacraments, or mysteries, of the Church and through our faithful offering of our entire selves to Jesus Christ.

Orthodox Christians interested in becoming a member of our Holy Cross parish need only to speak to Fr. Theodore and/or any Parish Council member who will assist you in becoming a member and steward of our church.

Non-Orthodox who are interested in becoming a member of Holy Cross may meet with Fr. Theodore so that their journey to Orthodoxy can be guided thoughtfully as a catechumen and the decision to become Orthodox can be made prayerfully and with peace and spiritual resolve.



What if I cannot fulfill my stewardship commitment?

Circumstances change from time to time and all you need to do is let us know so we can plan and budget accordingly. Your stewardship is valued because it is made out of your love for God and His Church. Please do not be concerned if you are unable to meet your stewardship commitment. We are glad you are part of this parish!

Tithing, giving ten percent of our income, is an act of obedience that acknowledges God as the giver of every good gift. By returning a portion of what He has entrusted to us, we declare that our lives and possessions belong to Him.

Financial Discipline:

Setting aside the tithe teaches order and moderation. It reminds us that all we have is for the glory of God and the good of others.


Support for the Body of Christ:
