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The reading is from Paul's Letter to
the Hebrews.
(13:7-16)

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Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their lives, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Therefore let us go forth to him outside the camp and bear the abuse he endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come. Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

At that time, as Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus's feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus: "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him: "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

Today our Holy Orthodox Church commemorates:

- Our Fathers among the Saints Athanasios (Αθανάσιος) and Cyril (Κύριλλος), Patriarchs of Alexandria

Saint Athanasios the Great (c. 296–373), Patriarch of Alexandria, was the Church's fearless defender of the divinity of Christ against the Arian heresy. A brilliant theologian from a young age and author of *On the Incarnation*, he stood firm for the faith proclaimed at the Council of Nicaea, enduring repeated exiles for his refusal to compromise the truth. Beloved by clergy and faithful alike, he strengthened Orthodoxy throughout Egypt, wrote the *Life of Saint Anthony the Great*, helped establish the biblical canon, and guided the Church through decades of trial with courage, wisdom, and pastoral love.

Saint Cyril of Alexandria (c. 376–444) followed in this same tradition as a powerful defender of the mystery of the Incarnation. As Patriarch, he opposed the Nestorian heresy, which divided Christ's divine and human natures, and presided over the Third Ecumenical Council at Ephesus in 431, affirming the true teaching of the Church and honoring the Virgin Mary as Theotokos. A devoted shepherd and profound teacher, Saint Cyril left lasting commentaries on the Gospels and faithfully guided the Church for over thirty years in truth and unity.

- The Holy Martyr Theodoula (Θεοδούλη) of Anazarbus in Cilicia (+304)
- The Holy Martyr Xenia (Ξένη)
- Saint Ulfrid, missionary in Germany and Sweden, martyred for destroying an image of Thor (+1028)

Through the intercessions of Your Saints, O God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.



Variable Hymns of the Day in the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom (page 8 in the Pew Book):

- Weekly Resurrectional Hymn (*Κατέλυσας τῷ Σταυρῷ σου*, Grave Mode):

You destroyed death by Your Cross, You opened Paradise to the Robber. You turned the Myrrh-bearing Women's lament into joy, and You commanded Your Apostles to preach that You rose, O Christ God, granting the world the great mercy. (Greek Text found in hymnal on pg. 122)

- Hymn of Saints Athanasios and Cyril (*Ἐργοῖς λάμψαντες*, Third Mode):

Striving brilliantly for Orthodoxy, and subduing all unorthodoxy, * you were honored with awards for your victories. * Enriching all with inspired theology, * your sacred writings profoundly adorn the Church. * O Athanasius and Cyril, you are now with Christ our God, * entreating Him to give to all the great mercy.

- Hymn of the Holy Cross (*Σώσον Κύριε*, First Mode):

Save, O Lord, save your people and bless Your inheritance. Give victory to those who battle evil and protect us all by Your Holy Cross. (Greek text found on the back of the bulletin)

- The Kontakion of the Meeting of the Lord (*Ο μήντραν παρθενικήν*, First Mode):

You sanctified the womb of the Virgin by Your birth, and by Your presentation You blessed the hands of Symeon, when You came, and You saved us, O Christ our God. Now we pray You give peace to Your world at war, and let love for Your people prevail in all, O only benevolent Lord. (Greek text found in hymnal on pg. 250)
